3rd Friday Games Night – Popular games of strategy and luck played each month at The Highlands Community Clubhouse at Lake Margaret.

Bocce Ball – Blend of bowling & horseshoes with a touch of shuffleboard. Takes place monthly from March – November generally on Tuesdays with a potluck lunch at The Highlands Community Clubhouse at Lake Margaret.

Golf For Fun – Co-ed group for clinic and golf. Players of all levels are welcome! Meets twice a month - April through October at The Golf Club at The Highlands.

Ladies Hand and Foot Cards – Popular meld-making card game. Meets on the 2nd Wednesday evening of every month at The Highlands Community Clubhouse at Lake Margaret.

Mah-Jongg – A game of strategy, skill and luck that meets every Wednesday afternoon at The Highlands Community Clubhouse at Lake Margaret.

Men's Poker Night – Card game that meets twice a month on Fridays at The Highlands Community Clubhouse at Lake Margaret.

Walking Club – Members meet on Monday and Thursday mornings to walk at various locations for lengths decided by the membership.
